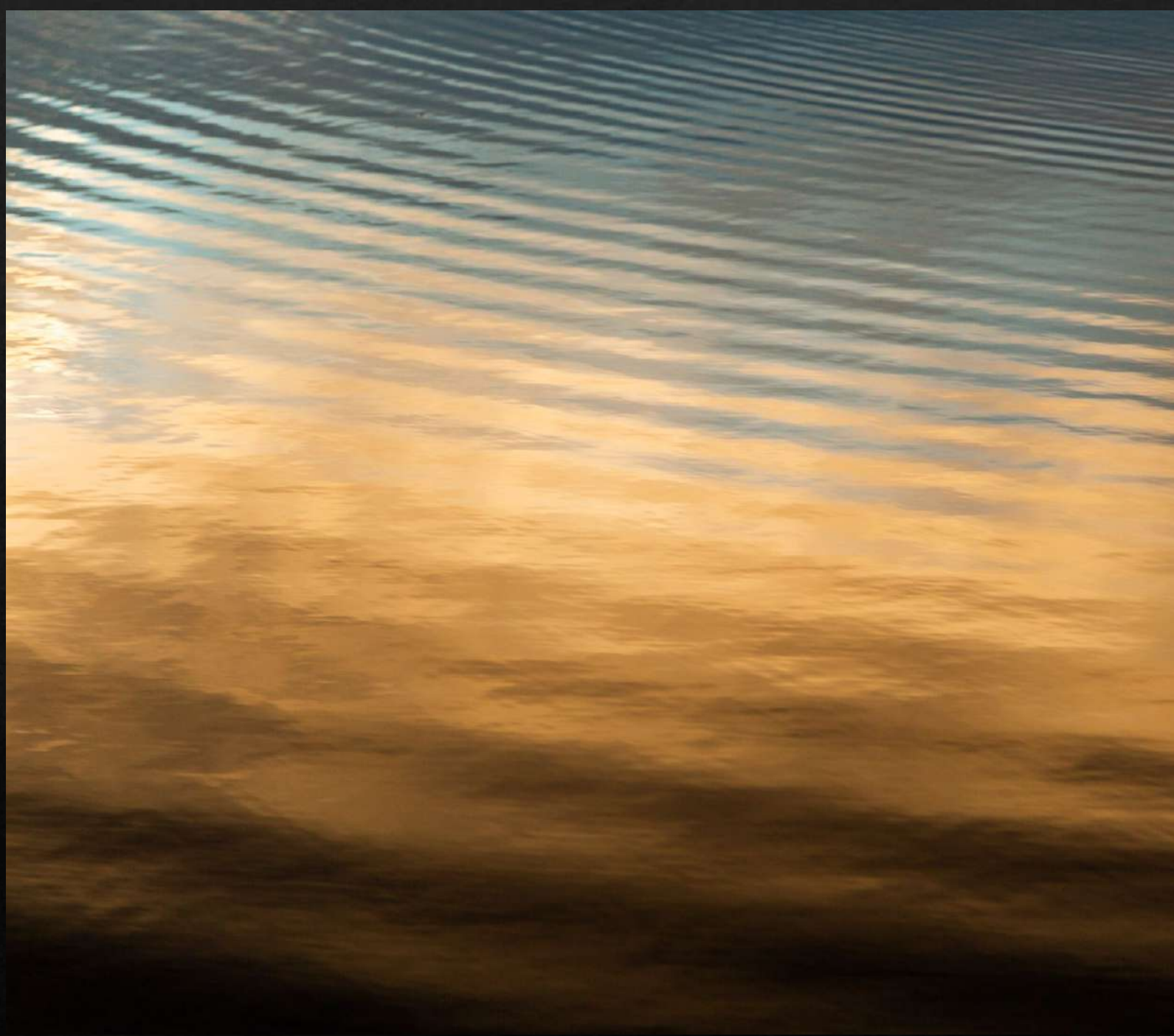

Imnarja

29th June

- Feast of St Peter and St Paul.
- One of the oldest feasts in Malta.
- The word luminarja is derived from the Latin word Luminare - to light up.
- This feast became a national feast for our country where everyone can meet at Buskett Gardens and celebrates everything that is Maltese.
- There will be animal shows- mainly farm animals, traditional music festival, horse races, fruit and vegetable exhibition and Maltese food stands.



Notte Bianca October

- This festival happens in our capital city Valletta.
- It is a night celebration of culture and arts.
- State palaces and museums open for exhibition and theatre performances.
- In the open-air streets and squares there will also be local and international musicians and dancers.
- Cafes and restaurants remain open until late along with many food stalls along the streets.



Village feasts all summer.



- From end of May until September.
- Every weekend there will be 1 or more village feast.
- It normally last 3 days, however, for the locals of that village it starts before.
- Village street and houses will be decorated and lit up.
- There will be fireworks all week long mainly at noon and evening until 10pm.
- Sunday morning there will be celebrations in the village square.
- On Sunday evening they will go around the village in a procession with the saint's statue accompanied by the local band.
- On Monday after the feast, most people from that village will take the day off work and go to the beach.



Festival Mediterranea. Mid Autumn

- This event is organized all around Gozo.
- Big variety of indoor and outdoor activities.
- There will be Opera and other music concerts.
- Conferences, talks and walks around ancient historical places.
- Traditional food and drinks, field work and art exhibitions.
- It is a great opportunity to get to know about the Gozitan history and its ancient places.



Malta International firework festival.

End of April

- This event is organised by the Ministry of Tourism and the Malta Tourism Authority.
- It is held to celebrate Malta's entry in the European Union which happened on the 1st of May 2004.
- It is held mainly in Valletta's Grand Harbour.
- It consists of fireworks show created by foreign companies and also local fireworks factories/groups.
